
I am honored to have served as president for two terms and look forward to continuing to serve the Bay Head Historical Society.

Bay Head Historic District is a new show which has been designed to answer the kinds of questions that are directed to the Bay Head Historical Society on a regular basis. With the use of maps (the 1883-Bay Head Land Company map, Sanborn Insurance maps and the National Historic Registry of Historic Places – Bay Head), we attempt to tell a story of ideas, development, preservation, restoration and sometimes loss. Several homes are highlighted with comments by the owners, these insights are all different but equally interesting. Perhaps the most fascinating is a very large illustration of Bay Head, depicting many of the great old buildings. This work was completed by Sam W. Wilson, a lifelong resident who celebrates the town's architectural legacy. 
